Resolution 2024-03-102

A RESOLUTION OPPOSING GOVERNOR LEE'S "EDUCATION FREEDOM ACT"

WHEREAS, the Tennessee Constitution, Article XI, Section 12, says the legislature "shall provide for the maintenance, support, and eligibility standards of a system of free public schools" and

WHEREAS, this constitutional guarantee is heavily reliant on adequate funding to equip schools with necessary resources to serve the various needs of Tennessee's public school students; and

WHEREAS, the DeKalb County Commission is charged with funding schools so that in DeKalb County schools, regardless of background, needs, or ability, all students receive the best possible educational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, DeKalb County Schools are the cornerstones of our community, serving every eligible DeKalb County student who wishes to enroll, including over 2800 students (30% from economically disadvantaged backgrounds) and employing over 450 people, and

WHEREAS, to provide a free and appropriate education for all, public schools need all available state funding in order to continue to improve and without necessitating an increased burden on local taxpayers, reducing services for students, or weakening the capacity of the public education system to serve all students effectively, and

WHEREAS, more than five decades after introduction, vouchers remain controversial, unpopular, and unproven; and

WHEREAS, public schools are transparent due to open meetings records laws, and state-mandated academic and financial standards, unlike private schools that do not follow state accountability standards, make budgets public, or adhere to open meetings records laws; and

WHEREAS, all educational institutions receiving public funds should have the same accountability and performance reporting expectations so that the public may understand the use and efficacy of those public funds; and

WHEREAS, DeKalb County Schools offer a wide range of specialized programs including special education services, career and technical education training aligned with local workforce needs, arts programs, after school programs, and much more; and

WHEREAS, vouchers give choices to private schools, not to students' parents, since private schools decide whether they will accept vouchers, which students they want to admit, and what reasons they might use to dismiss students; and

WHEREAS, the proposed bill lacks sufficient oversight, accountability, and transparency mechanisms, raising concerns about misuse of public funds; and,

WHEREAS, the DeKalb County Commission believes public funds should be directed to public schools for the betterment of the student population and community overall;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the DeKalb County Commission urges the Tennessee General Assembly to consider the effects that Education Savings Accounts will have on local school districts and to instead seek ways to support and strengthen public schools throughout the state.

RESOLVED, DULY ADOPTED AND EFFECTIVE upon passage, the public welfare requiring it.



The First speaker was Suzanne Williams

She spoke about the new tourism website is up and going but a possibility of a name change for the site.

The Three Star grant contract was signed. This grant was for \$50,000 for the schools for media equipment.

The Alexandria grant for \$15,00 was signed.

DeKalb County was accepted for the Destination Branding Program. Only 4 counties in TN were accepted. April 18th there will be a meeting and 12 people will be invited to be part of the committee for the branding project.

She is still working on the Arts Grant.

DeKalb Co Clean Up Day is May 4th.

I (Tony Luna) ask for DeKalb Co recognize Eddie and Tara Ramos for their efforts in cleaning Center Hill Lake and Dekalb county clean. We would like to recognize them on May 4th

The Chamber asked the County Commission to look in to and help with the Community Theater.

The Second Speaker Was Karyn Walker with the Smithville Merchants Alliance

She spoke about the First Friday Events. The business downtown stays open until 7 or 8 on the first Friday of every month. She would like to have more participation from Dekalb County. This is something that the county and city governments can team up with to help the local businesses.

Randy Caldwell was the next speaker.

He went over the rebranding of Dekalb County as a tourism destination through social media, websites, attraction maps, STR promotional print media, cross promotional with all of DeKalb Co.

DeKalb County Commission Jail Committee

The DeKalb County Jail Committee meet subsequently after a town hall meeting on the topic of the jail at approximately 6:30pm.

The Jail Committee started with a presentation from TreanorHL that demonstrated if a facility could be placed on the existing property of the current jail facility. According to TreanorHL, a new facility could be placed on the current property. The design presented demonstrated the effort of building a facility of four stories between the property of Diane Kirby and the existing jail. Some comments were made of whether a building could be built on the property line as it was portrayed. Some other considerations were presented that there would be no parking, impound lot, and no room for future expansion. TreanorHL also noted that the courts if desired could be built where the existing jail is located but the existing building would need to be demolished.

The Jail Committee requested that we inquire of the construction and staffing costs of each scenario that has been presented. The committee also would like to visualize these options side by side in an “apples to apples” comparison. CTAS Representative Jim Hart confirmed he would make a staffing study to the scenarios that were presented.

The Jail Committee then took public comments.

Afterwards, Jeff Barnes made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Glynn Merriman. Motion passed by acclamation.

County Commissioners

It has recently come to our attention that a house was put on the incorrect parcel in 2017. This resulted in an adjacent property owner paying property taxes on a structure they did not own. Normally this is caught and corrected in the same tax year but in the case, it was unknown by both parties involved. To correct this error the county commission would need to grant permission to the trustee to refund for tax years 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020. The trustee without permission can refund tax years 2021, 2022 and 2023. This would be a revenue neutral transaction. Steven Kirby would receive a refund in the approximate amount of \$29,776.

Deborah Mason and Doug Cosner would receive a bill in the approximate amount of \$29,776.

All parties involved are aware of the situation and agree that this is the way to proceed. I have spoken with Doug Cosner and he indicated that he would issue a check for the amount above immediately upon receipt of the new tax notice.
